## Introduction



Pyramid Model Australia (PMA) was established and incorporated in 2018 leveraging from the passion and drive of a network of early childhood professionals who had participated in Pyramid Model (PM) training with Dr. Mary Louise Hemmeter- Vanderbilt University 2011- 2014.

Janene Swalwell, a leader in the Early Childhood sector, together with Early Childhood Intervention Association Victoria /Tasmania (ECIA Vic/Tas) invited *Dr. Mary Louise Hemmeter* to Australia with a vision of establishing the Pyramid Model into Australian early childhood services. With momentum created by the training, a number of pivotal activities took place across the sectors galvanising commitment, including a pilot of the Pyramid Model in Preschools, and system-wide Pyramid Model approach and evaluation implemented across all preschools in one Victorian Local Government Area. A team of local trainers were trained commencing in NSW, then Victoria. A grant, received in conjunction with ECIA Vic/Tas, also enabled the development of a suite of Australian PM resources.

From 2018 until 2021, Pyramid Model Australia was convened by Janene Swalwell and guided and supported by Dr. Mary Louise

Hemmeter and colleagues at the Pyramid Model Consortium in the USA. PMA's role focussed on developing and maintaining the

PMA website, coordinating and delivering training and coaching, developing resources, evaluation and data collection, disseminating research evidence and program information as well as providing support to professionals trained in the Pyramid Model.

With the sad and recent passing of *Janene Swalwell*, PMA are embarking on a new chapter. Under the leadership of *President Dr. Kerry Bull*, *an established practitioner*, *leader and researcher in the early childhood sector*, PMA is paving a new strategic direction in continued collaboration with *Dr. Mary Louise Hemmeter* and colleagues at Pyramid Model Consortium.



The Pyramid Model Australia (PMA) Strategic Plan 2022-2025 was developed using a strategic planning process designed by Groupwork Institute and Associates (GIA) and facilitated by Jacquie Simpson- Collaboration Consultant.

The Strategic Plan workshop was conducted in March 2022 involving all five current members of the PMA committee:
